## PUBLIC HEARING.

#### Ordinance 09-03

- A. Clerk offers Proof of Publication.
- B. Ordinance is read by title only:

"An Ordinance of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, Authorizing the Exercise of Eminent Domain, if Advisable, to Acquire 75 Werimus Road (Block 1401, Lot 6) in the Borough of Woodcliff Lake"

This Ordinance is for property acquisition only and to exercise eminent domain if advisable. This is the public hearing and the Ordinance permits the Borough Attorney to file the necessary eminent domain paperwork. Owners stated that they would not negotiate with the Borough until eminent domain was declared. The Borough has received two grants totaling almost 1.8 million dollars. Acquisition will not affect the tax rate. Funds are also available for this project in the Open Space Fund.

C. Motion to open the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Bader, second by Mr. Rosenblatt and approved unanimously by voice call vote.

Jeff Goldsmith, Old Farms Road asked for the Mayor and Council to explain "if advisable". Attorney Madaio stated that this simply means if necessary. The Borough is at an impasse on these negotiations but not necessarily adversarial. Mr. Goldsmith asked about the Freedman

property. The Council had previously adopted an enabling ordinance with the understanding that the acquisition of the Hatheway Property is the key. Mr. Goldsmith stated that he was on the Council that initially acquired the Cougar/Duffy property.

Kevin O'Brien, 227 Pascack Road asked if this property is not acquired, where else could the Borough develop land for recreational usage. Administrator Sandve stated that there probably is not another suitable site in the Borough for recreational usage.

Jeff Levin, 10 Wright Street North asked what the increase of taxes will be with the development of this property. Mayor LaPaglia stated that there would be a loss of \$24,000 in taxes due to changing the property to municipal owned. With respect to development, in-depth research will be needed. Additional grant funding must be applied for. The property is "developable" but at what cost. Mr. Levin stated that in the current state of the economy, this unknown cost seems a bit risky.

Bernie Kettler, Glen Road stated that with all due respect to grants, once you buy a property you take it off the tax rolls. He asked why the Borough can't work with the County at Wood Dale Park. The Borough can still keep the ratables with plenty of parking.

Jessie Mulligan, 56 Werimus Road asked if there had been any discussion with other towns about sharing recreational facilities. Mrs. Howley stated that there have been discussions with other towns however our fields are already over used with just town activities. Mr. Mulligan asked how the neighbors can be involved as they are directly in the middle of this proposed development. All development will be done with the least intrusion on residents. Mr. Bader stated that administration and residents will work together. There will be a committee of councilmembers, Parks and Recreation director and residents on the development phase. Mr. Mulligan will be a member.

Joanne Fells, Werimus Road will also be a member the committee when it is formed.

Diane Mautz, 192 Pascack Road stated that she lives right next door to Borough Hall. There was a committee formed when the firehouse was constructed and it worked very well. She commended Mayors Higgins, Kettler and LaPaglia for always working with the residents.

Brian Stone, 12 Carriage Lane asked for a timeline on this project. Mayor LaPaglia stated that he can only speak in generalities. He will be happy to complete the acquisition by the end of the year. Only then can the design phase begin.

Patricia Altomare is the renter of the rear of the Hatheway Property. She has a concern of the length of time the property will sit undeveloped. With no real idea of when it will be developed, there will be no maintenance. Mr. Bader stated the municipality will maintain this property as it does their other buildings. She stated that fields will only serve a small percentage of the community for a short period of time. Mr. Rosenblatt stated that there are not enough fields in the Borough.

Greg Fralin, stated that the town cannot afford this type of development. We should live within our means. He is against this acquisition.

Michael Tsontakis, 60 Wyandemere Road is the current commissioner of baseball. He addressed some of the statistics stated tonight. Every season you play sports is seasonal. The number of teams has tripled within the last five years. In the fall, there is baseball and soccer. In the spring there is lacrosse, baseball and softball. There is tremendous strain on the fields, which are used 7 days a week. Only two fields can be used by older children after school.

Gerry Meisel, 105 Brookview Drive stated that he has been a resident of Woodcliff Lake for over 40 years. This is an excellent acquisition and will be intelligently developed. This type of development will keep the values of homes high. Trust this Mayor and Council as we did Mayor Kettler and Mayor Higgins.

Pete Hurlihy, 75 Werimus Road asked what the use for the Driscoll Property is. Mr. Bader stated that within the next few months, a toddler park could be constructed. Due to its historic

designation, there are limited uses for this property.

Kevin O'Brien, 227 Pascack Road stated that you cannot have expanded growth without expansion of recreational facilities.

Jay Esposito, Woodcliff Lake Parks and Recreation Director stated that there are numerous problems with field scheduling. Old Mill Park was built with a committee and it worked out well

Jeff Goldsmith, Old Farms Road asked if Green Acres and County funds are used, can the County have access to our facility. Administrator Sandve stated he will look into this. Mr. Goldsmith asked to find the needs assessment (that was) done in 2000 for the residents to review. Bernie Kettler, Glen Road stated that there is a concern for parking in this area. Mrs. Howley stated she would speak with the Freeholder Board.

Hearing no further questions from the public, a motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Mr. Glaser, second by Mr. Bader and approved unanimously by voice call vote.

### ADMINISTRATION/FINANCE, PLANNING BOARD, EDUCATION (High School)

Mr. Glaser reported that there will be a budget meeting at March 19, 2009 at 7:00. The Budget will be introduced on April 6, 2009.

The Planning Board has a presentation on the Broadway Corridor study. A draft will be given to the Council as soon as it is received.

#### LIBRARY, FIRE (VOLUNTEER)

Mr. Camella reported that Pearl River increased their non-resident library fees to \$325.00 on April 1, 2009. Mr. Camella asked for Council approval for him to write Pearl River to ask them to reconsider. Upper Saddle River and Ridgewood are \$350.00.

At a recent Fire Department Drill, there was an injury to a member. The Engine Truck is out of commission due to a water tank leak. Woodcliff Lake "jaws of life" was used in a recent auto accident in Montvale.

There was CERT training held in Mahwah for emergency volunteers.

### PUBLIC SAFETY/POLICE/OEM/TRI-BORO

Mr. Bader reported that there has been an increase in DWIs in town due to increased enforcement.

Mr. Bader stated that the DPW should be commended for their assistance in aiding the ambulance corp. to remove a resident from their house. The driveway needed to be plowed before the ambulance could go up the driveway. The DPW was on the site without being radioed to do so.

There will be a special joint meeting of the Woodcliff Lake Council and Montvale Council. Since the boys and girls basketball teams were the State North Section 1, Group 2 champions, Mr. Bader suggested proclamations be given to the teams before the special closed session meeting next week.

### Resolution To Amend the Current Binding Interest Arbitration Laws

WHEREAS, personnel and personnel related costs make up approximately 70% + of municipal budgets; and

WHEREAS, binding interest arbitration has been a principal reason for the increase in public safety salaries and therefore correlates to increased salaries for all public employees; and

WHEREAS, there is a strong connection between current binding arbitration awards and the overwhelming property tax burden on the residents of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, an amendment of binding interest arbitration laws to mandate greater emphasis on the Municipalities ability to pay and the impact on the tax paying public would help to level the playing field and lessen the impact upon resident.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey hereby encourages the Legislature and the Governor, to amend the current binding interest arbitration laws to provide municipalities with a fairer and more appropriate process.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a copy of this Resolution shall be sent to Governor Jon Corzine, the Legislators to the 39<sup>th</sup> District, Municipalities of Bergen and Passaic Counties and the New Jersey League of Municipalities.
